## 2022 Annual Report

#### **President's Report**

The past year has been a relatively successful one for WHO. Responses to the COVID-19 pandemic had caused disruption to our normal activities in the previous two years. Whilst the pandemic is not over, the relative risk to individuals has decreased significantly and the responses reduced accordingly. Consequently, orienteering activities were largely unaffected and we were able to hold our usual events in 2022. These included events in the Western Sydney Orienteering Series (Dec, Jan), the Sydney Summer Series (Feb, Mar), the MetroLeague (Aug), the Turkey Trot (Jul) and the State League (May). Thank you to all club members that contributed to make these events happen. They don't happen by themselves!

The following are my highlights for our club for the past year:

- Hosting a middle distance NSW State League event at Wyangala. The all female organising team, comprised of Karen Langan, Rebecca George and Sheralee Bailey, did a brilliant job and the rest of the club chipped in to make it a memorable event. It was very pleasing to have 40% of our club participating the most I can recall at a State League event in quite some time.
- The Turkey Trot was back after missing two years. Atrocious weather didn't dampen
  the spirits of the competitors and some continue to claim it is their favourite O event of
  the year.
- Janet Morris receiving the 2022 NSW Sport Distinguished Service Award for Orienteering. She is a humble recipient but mammoth contributor and we are proud of this recognition for all that she does for our club and sport.
- Savanna Sweeney's selection in the Australian Schools Honours Team. Savanna had some excellent results at the Aus Schools Champs in Victoria and was rightly rewarded. We've had a number of WHO juniors selected for NSW in the past few years and to see one of them go to the next level is really exciting.
- WHO came third in the NSW Interclub challenge. We came out in front of some very strong clubs and were only bettered by the monster clubs of Garingal and Newcastle.

Next year will see WHO host the NSW Schools Championship, as part of the NSW State League. This will be our biggest challenge in 2023, with two sprints on a new map followed by a bush event the following day. I know it's a challenge we are up for and look forward to this event and all that 2023 will bring.

## 2022 Annual Report

### **Treasurer's Report (abridged)**

This report covers the full year period 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> September, 2022.

#### **Event Summary**

During the year there were ten events. Unfortunately, two Summer Series Events were cancelled due to COVID-19. Prior to COVID we were running 13 events/year. We were able to successfully run the Turkey Trot and a State League event.

A summary of the financial details for each event will be provided prior to the AGM.

#### **Financial Results**

The Income and Expenditure Report and the Balance Sheet are attached. Key highlights are:

- The club ended the year with a small surplus of revenue over expenditure
- Minor event revenue decreased due to not being able to run 2 Sydney Summer Series events. There was also a decrease in attendance at Western Summer Series events down by 60 across 4 events when compared with previous year.
- Major event income exceeded expenditure.
- Transaction fees charged by Paypal (which were previous covered by ONSW) and Square results in the club receiving less income than when participants paid by cash in the past.
- Another government grant will enable the aquisition of equipment for the club. The proposal is to purchase new light weight stands for the SI units.
- ONSW sanctioning fees were the greatest expense item followed by printing costs.

#### **Mapping Officer's Report**

Mapping activity has continued with minor updates of maps done as needed. Barry Hanlon continues to provide base maps of excellent quality. We do have enough maps though it would be good to find more suitable areas, particularly bush maps. The lack of opportunities to use current minor sprint maps is noticeable. We need to discuss our event schedule to see how to best use our maps.

#### **State League**

The search for bush maps has continued with visits to N Wyangala SRA (Quartpot Camping Area) and NW Wyangala (Markhams Creek Camping Area). The Markhams Creek area is promising. Guula Ngurra NP areas of interest continue to be closed to the public. The club needs an area for 2024 and Markhams Creek and Portland Common will be followed up for permission to use.

#### **Sydney and District Line Course Maps**

Currently these maps are used for Metro and Western Sydney Orienteering Series (WSOS) events. Parklands at St Clair and Toongabbie have been mapped and will be used for WSOS but these could be one-off events. Wianamatta Regional Park West Visitors Area at Jordan Springs is being mapped for a Metro and is an unusual area of runnable bushland though extensive wetlands will limit the usable area. Also, public facilities have not yet been built. The north end of Western Sydney Regional Park has been remapped in sprint format for the WHO Cup. If extended, it could be used for a Metro. Current maps at Fred Caterson, Caddies Creek and Ermington all have major changes to sporting fields planned so we must be ready to update when the sporting fields are completed.

#### Sydney Summer Series (SSS) Maps

The west section of our new Castlewood map has been used. The east section may be joined to part of our West Pennant Hills map for another SSS map next summer. The Stevensons Creek map has been completed ready for a SSS event. A map at West Cherrybrook is being fieldworked by Ian Miller and Graham Hill.

#### **Sprints**

Permission to use Kings has been received and a base map prepared. This will be a major sprint map. We have other minor sprint maps but as the summer sprint series has been discontinued we do not have a current opportunity to use them.

#### **Turkey Trot**

A base map of the Fairfield area has been prepared and field checks have commenced.
