This took a lot of time but once again, was tremendous to see others enjoyment of the resultant event. The third but maybe the most pleasing of all was organising our club's 40th birthday celebrations, which turned out to be a wonderful evening for all that attended.

The following are my highlights for our club for the past year:

- WHO reached the 40 year milestone.
- Steve Dunlop was named as the club's 6th Life Member. As a founding member it seemed fitting to make this announcement at the 40th Birthday celebration.
- WHO members stepping up. We've had people contributing for the first time, trying new roles or the same roles at a higher level. Really pleasing to see.
- Unveiling of a new Metroleague map at Jordan Springs thanks Janet.
- WHO hosted the NSW Schools Championships. This required extensive liaising with The King's School for access, mapping and the actual event. It resulted in a new sprint map and maybe, just maybe, the start of an orienteering relationship with the school. The bush event at Mulgoa the following day stretched our resources and despite some of the longer courses being a bit long, the junior kid's courses were spot on.
- The Turkey Trot ventured into South West Sydney.
- Savanna Sweeney was again selected in the Australian Schools Honours Team and was one of four juniors representing NSW at the Australian Schools Champs in Western Australia (Savanna, Matilda, Lachlan, Shay).
- WHO came third in the NSW Interclub challenge. Once again, with only Garingal and Newcastle in front of us.

Thank you to all club members that contributed to make 2023 a great year. I'm looking forward to 2024, where I hope we will continue to grow.

Treasurer's Report (abridged)

This report covers the full year period 1st October, 2022 to 31st September, 2023.

Event Summary

During the year there were 13 events. Financial details for each event are show in the accompanying Annual Event Report 2022-2023 on page 6.

Highlights include:

- Over 1800 entries across 13 events.
- Minor event income totaling increased compared to the previous year but not back up to pre COVID minor event incomes.
- We ran two major events, one of the Xmas 5 days at Mt Piper and the NSW Schools Championships, with a combined major event income
- Western Summer Series ran at a loss but most other events achieved a healthy surplus.

Financial Results

The Income and Expenditure Report and the Balance Sheet are available on request to the Secretary.

Key highlights are:

- The year ended with a small surpluse of income over expenditure.
- WHO celebrated its 40th Birthday this year and the club subsidized the event.
- Club member development was assisted.
- ONSW sanctioning fees were the greatest expense item, followed by costs related to venue and amenities hire.
- In summary, WHO finances are stable.

Mapping Officer's Report

The club has sufficient maps for the coming year, though we must continue to update our maps and look for new areas. Barry continues to provide base maps and to look at new areas using publicly available data.

Our maps can be grouped depending on their suitability for different types of event.

State League Bush Maps

We would benefit from new or revived areas for country State League events.

Markhams Creek Camping Area at Wyangala dam was identified as a suitable area to map . It should be followed up when needed

A western extension to our Mt Piper Hills map for use in 2025 has been proposed and a visit to Mt Piper to discuss access was scheduled. Unfortunately the meeting could not take place as Blue Mountains highways were closed on the day due to an accident. Will be followed up later as we have a contact there willing to talk to us

Barry has been identifying suitable farm areas which welcome visitors and has been talking to owners. So far with no success. It is important that we continue to search for bush areas.

Sydney and District Line Course Maps

Used for MetroLeagues and Western Sydney Orienteering Series (WSOS) events, and sometimes lent to Saturday Orienteering Series (SOS), these maps are important for new comers to learn basic line orienteering. We have enough, particularly now that our number of WSOS events has been reduced, though areas continue to change. Wianamatta Regional Park West at Jordan Springs, was successfully used for the first time at our Metro this year and will be improved when planned wetland areas are complete - hopefully with some visitor facilities. Two other maps (Fred Caterson/Cattai Creek and Caddies Creek) still have sporting field changes impending so will need updates. Currently Bungaribee Park is being mapped and should be suitable for a Metro. Kings School also has potential as a Metro map using its bush areas.

Sydney Summer Series (SSS) Maps

A map (Dual Creeks) between Dural and Cherrybrook has been completed by Ian Miller and Graeme Hill and was used this summer. Our West Pennant Hills map has been extended by adding East Castlewood and will also be used this summer. We have a sufficient number of SSS maps though new or upgraded maps could continue to be added.

Sprints

Kings School was completed and used for a State League event but generally we have no club use for sprint maps though some can be lent to SOS. For example, Western Sydney University at Richmond was used very successfully by SOS.

Turkey Trot

Various creeks and parks in the Fairfield area were mapped and used for Turkey Trot 2023 but it is unlikely they will be used again. An area including Concord and Putney is proposed for the Turkey Trot 2024 and a base map has been prepared by Barry.
